



ABOUT US

The Cobblestone Society was established in 1960 with a mission to preserve the oldest Cobblestone Church (1834) in North America, and to collect and disseminate information on the unique form of cobblestone masonry construction (1825-1860) primarily found in New York State.

The Cobblestone Museum consists of eight major historic buildings. Next to the Cobblestone Church is a cobblestone house (1836), which was once owned by famous publisher Horace Greeley. These two buildings are furnished to show how they would have been used in the 1880's. A third cobblestone building is the Gaines District No. 5 Schoolhouse, made of small lake-washed stone in 1849.

Four wooden buildings include a blacksmith shop, print shop, harness shop, and an exhibit hall of 19th century farming tools. A brick house dating back to 1836 serves as a Resource Center where information is kept relating to the 1,200+ cobblestone buildings found in North America. The second floor of the brick house serves as a gallery with changing exhibits.

Admissions is located in our gift shop on the ground floor of the Cobblestone Church. The adjacent reception center houses a photo display of cobblestone masonry buildings and a room for exhibits. The Cobblestone Church is available for weddings whatever your religious beliefs.

The Cobblestone Museum is open May-October.
